Epiphany

The Season of Epiphany is from the Feast of the Epiphany through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which is

anywhere from four to nine weeks depending on the date of Easter.

The Epiphany of the Lord, from the Greek *epiphaneia*, meaning manifestation or appearance, officially takes place on January 6, the culmination of the Twelve Days of Christmas. This season predates the Christian celebration of Christmas, originally focusing on the nativity, incarnation, and baptism of Christ. We will recognize Epiphany as a congregation on Sun-

day, January 1, celebrating the coming of the three wise men (magi) who brought gifts to the Christ child. The arrival of these visitors was a sign that the incarnation of God was here and recognized by the heavens – an observance of great majesty, solemnity, and awe. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany. The gospels for the other

Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the wedding at Cana, the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday of the Epiphany season is always devoted to the Transfiguration of Christ, revealing Christ's glory prior to the crucifixion, and his anticipated resurrection and ascension. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ.

We are called to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity recorded in the gospels of the Epiphany season. We hope you join us on this beautiful journey.





Baptisms


