

April 11: Tour Eternal Gandhi Museum

Eternal Gandhi Museum Houston (EGMH) is the first museum in the Americas dedicated to preserving and promoting Mahatma Gandhi's legacy of nonviolent conflict resolution.

The culmination of the dreams and work of Indian native Atul Kothari and a cadre of like-minded individuals, the museum officially opened its doors to the public on August 15, 2023, with the Grand ribbon-cutting ceremony on October 2, the 154th anniversary of Gandhi's birth.

Events preceding this opening include a week-long citywide celebration of Gandhi's birthday culminating with "1000 Lights for Peace."

Gandhi's transformative philosophy of nonviolence not only led to India's independence but inspired the civil rights movement and social justice movements across the globe.

The museum is "not about objects but for someone" —

inspiring champions of peace with each visitor. The goal is to encourage visitors to embrace these values in their own lives.

From the design of the building, the visitor experience, and the educational programming, the museum is the essence of Gandhi's teachings, highlighting his way of life.

The outer walls of the semicircle-shaped museum depict various peace activists including Mahatma Gandhi, Martin Luther King Jr., Nelson Mandela, Betty Williams. A statue of Gandhi stands in front of the museum.

At 9:30 am Thursday, April 11, St. Paul's Primetimers will go by church bus to the museum where a docent-led tour will be conducted.
