Bikes, Bluebonnets, & Birds at Willow Waterhole; Learn More at March 14 Primetimers Meeting

Willow Waterhole Greenway (WWG) is a 300-plus-acre network of lakes, prairie, marsh, islands, native plants, wildlife, and park amenities. This unusual combination was designed to protect against Houston's inevitable flooding and to bring the community together for conservation, education, and recreation.

Still relatively unknown to many Houstonians, this gem of nature is tucked away just south of Meyerland, and one of the primary people behind its establishment and ongoing development is St. Paul's member and WWG Conservancy President, Bill Burhans, who will tell us all about it March 14.

While home to many Girl Scout Gold and Boy Scout Eagle award projects, organized birding outings, and many people simply fishing, walking, biking, picnicking, or playing, perhaps the site's major contribution is as a flood control project.

Starting in 2003, six lakes were created to absorb and detain stormwater that would have caused Willow Waterhole and Brays bayous to overflow into nearby neighborhoods.

Ranging in size from 10 to 110 acres, they were engineered as wet-bottom lakes to support permanent pools of water while providing a stop-over site for migrating birds. WWG also provides a safe habitat year around for many species of animals and plants, including the endangered



native Texas prairie dawn flower.

A disparate list of government agencies and other entities came together to make WWG happen — most recently a major grant from the Kinder Foundation. Find out how — and what you can do there — at the March 14 meeting, beginning at 10am this month.
