Pastor's Message

In the Lenten season we have been travelling with Jesus as he "turned his face toward Jerusalem." We have been looking at the characteristics of a disciple and how the sacrificial love that Jesus taught is to be modeled in our own lives.

Early in April we head into Holy Week, and we remember the shouts of Hosana on Palm Sunday and then the shouts of Crucify Him on Good Friday. And then the joy-filled celebration of Easter Sunday. Holy Week is a reminder that through Christ we have strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow.



Did you know that Easter is the only day on the Christian calendar that is set by the moon? Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal

equinox. I think that is great that we see new life springing up in flowers and buds on the trees and we experience a new life in the risen Savior.

I love the words to the hymn by Eleanor Farjeon, or you may remember it being sung by Cat Stevens: Morning has broken like the first morning;

All around us we are seeing new life springing up! I hope that you are experiencing the joy of being Easter people.

Primetimers: Visit Houston Botanic Garden

After remediating the 132-acre site formerly occupied by the Glenbrook municipal golf course, the Houston Botanic Garden broke ground in 2019 to become a place that enriches "life through discovery, education, and the conservation of plants and the natural environment."

Approximately half of that acreage is on an island surrounded by the Sims Bayou channel and meanders. That island now holds the Global Collection and Culinary gardens plus a pine grove and woodland glade. In addition, the South Garden section holds the Susan Garver Family Discovery Garden and the Community Garden.



On Thursday, April 21, St. Paul's Primetimers will explore the gardens at their own pace and then settle in for a class about tropical plants.

The warm and sunny Houston climate makes our homes and gardens ideal places to grow tropicals plants, and the instructor will talk about some of the most fascinating varieties and how to care for them at home. Each participant will take home a small potted tropical plant.

In your discovery walk, you may wish to preview some of those topical plants.

As you enter the Botanic Garden, the Welcome Fountain on the left gently nudges you toward the Global Garden, which includes tropical and subtropical specimens. (This garden also includes plants for arid climates). To the right of the entry is the Culinary Garden.

St. Paul's member Claudia Gee Vassar is president and general counsel of Houston Botanic Garden.

The class size is limited to 15 people. To reserve your spot, RSVP by Thursday, April 14, by emailing *primetimers@stpaulshouston.org* or by calling 713-528-0527. The per-person cost of \$25 payable in advance covers garden entry, the class, and a box lunch. Lunch will be in the Picnic Grove.

St. Paul's Methodist Foundation Grants \$108,000 in Scholarships for Higher Education

Johanna Wolfe, Executive Director of the Foundation, is pleased to announce that this year \$108,000 in scholarships have been awarded to 43 students.

For more than 40 years each spring the St. Paul's Methodist Foundation has awarded scholarships to students pursuing degrees in higher education. The Foundation currently administers 17 endowed scholarship funds that benefit high school seniors matriculating to institutions of higher education, as well as college undergraduate students, seminarians, and graduate students. An additional fund, honoring long-time St. Paul's School director Zane Ann Tigett is dedicated to assisting students at the pre-school.

Grant awards are based on the applicant's relationship to St. Paul's UMC, academics, extra-curricular activities, recommendations, and a personal essay. Eight of the funds are restricted to specific parameters established by the donors. Recipients are selected annually by the Foundation's Scholarship Committee .


