Changes are coming to our Sunday morning worship opportunities, re-gathering guidelines, and community life starting Sunday, May 23 — the *Feast of Pentecost*.

The Re-gathering Task Force and Church Council agree that the St. Paul's community can begin having masked and distanced gatherings indoors at the end of May. Each gathering, small group, and ministry area will discern the right meeting option for its group — online, hybrid, outdoors, or indoors. Mindful of our call to inclusion, St. Paul's will continue to support each option as we are able. Some areas of our community life may remain online long-term while others will move to indoor or hybrid gatherings over the coming months.

Worship will move to the Sanctuary at 11 am, starting May 23. RSVP still will be required via Eventbrite or a call the church office: 713-528-0527. Online worship streaming remains at 8:30 and 9:45 am, with 11:05 moving to 11 am.

Every conference in the Unted Methodist Church has a bishop to serve as a leader. Larger conferences share bishops with those that are too small or too new to have their own bishops. The Texas Annual Conference shares Bishop Scott J. Jones with the provisional Annual Conference of Laos.

Sandwiched between Thailand and Viet Nam, Laos is the only landlocked country in Southeast Asia. The Laotian pastors and communities face restrictions of religious practices plus poverty and low levels of education. Despite these adversities, the Methodist church currently has 65 churches in Laos, and this number continues to grow.

St. Paul's Senior Pastor Rev. Dr. Jeff McDonald is part of a team that has been traveling to Laos annually to train and credential new pastors as well as build relationships between the Texas Annual Conference and the Lao Samphan Methodist Church.

Green Team, Community Garden



At St. Paul's, Helen Spaw conducts healing circles on a variety of topics, some are ongoing with entry at any time, some are short-term with a self-contained group.



Reading John for Dear Life: A Spiritual Walk with the Fourth Gospel



Disciple Fast-Track Bible Study: Old Testament


