The first Sunday in October is World Communion Sunday, and St. Paul's will join many Christian churches across the globe for this celebration of unity among churches across denominations. Much of the music will be sung in Spanish as well as English.

The message will be brought by Rev. Dr. Wilson Boots, a St. Paul's affiliated clergy and retired Director of Interpretation for Encounter with Christ, the UMC's General Board of Global Ministries permanent fund for support

of partnership in mission with Methodist churches in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The Blessing of the Animals service will be on the Plaza at 4 pm. The Wesley Singers and Choristers will sing. All pets are welcome on leashes or in carriers for personal pet blessings after the service. Stuffed animals and pictures of pets also are welcome.

Donations of pet food will be received on behalf of Animeals on Wheels. The Green Team will provide information about creation care and herbs from St. Paul's Community Garden. Bring your own water.

Celebrate Bible Sunday

Continuing a long tradition, St. Paul's third graders will receive personalized Bibles during the 11 am worship service on October 10.

And a new tradition will begin that day with toddlers to tweens receiving an age-appropriate Bible story book or Bible in their Sunday School classes for use at home and church.





Also needed are financial sponsors and mentors, daytime volunteers to sort donated items, and drivers to pick up the refugees from the airport to take them to interim housing. The airport pickups would be on weekend evenings, the drivers would be using church buses, and each trip would take approximately two hours plus the time to get the bus. A commercial driver's license is not needed.

UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON COLLEGE OF MEDICINE

Learn about the new telemedicine clinic directed in Abraham Station by the University of Houston colleges of medicine and nursing.

The initiators of the clinic — Rev. Andrew Wolfe, St. Paul's Pastor for Congregational Care, and Dr. Shainy Varghese, PhD, RN, CPNP, Associate Professor, UH College of Nursing — will present the October 14 Primetimers program. They will cover the history that led to the clinic — why St. Paul's, why UH — as well as healthcare disparities in Texas, and the current goals with the clinic and its anticipated future.

The clinic is open on Mondays from 8:30 am to 1 pm and provides these services to the medically under-served: wellness exams, sick visits, mental health screening, well-woman exams, chronic disease management, lab testing, vaccinations, referrals, and assistance in finding healthcare resources.

The Primetimers program is open to all and starts with a gathering at 10:30 am in Abraham Station, 5401 Fannin. Cornerstone Society Awards Grants to JFAI & FAM Houston

Members of the Cornerstone Society voted to award their discretionary funding to two local ministry partners: Justice for All Immigrants (www.justiceforall immigrants.org, formerly Justice for Our Neighbors Houston) and FAM Houston (www.famhoustontx.org).

Both of these agencies had received grant funding from the St. Paul's Methodist Foundation earlier in the year and had been recommended by the Grants Committee (along with

three other agencies) to be considered for additional funding by the Cornerstone Society.

Due to COVID protocols, the grants were awarded during site visits to each of the ministries. JFAI was granted \$5,083, and FAM Houston received \$2,542. The remaining \$7,625 in Cornerstone Society contributions was directed to the Foundation's Building and Facilities Fund, which is the original purpose of the Foundation.

In this first year of the Cornerstone Foundation, more than 150 members and friends of St. Paul's said "Yes!" and illustrated the importance that a \$100 gift can make by helping to ensure the preservation of the buildings of St. Paul's and in supporting two of our ministry partners. Membership is renewed annually.




St. Paul's Choir Returning to United Kingdom next Summer

The members of St. Paul's Choir are excited to be returning to the United Kingdom in the summer of 2022 to spend a week as Choir-in-Residence at Truro Cathedral in Cornwall and to sing for an Evensong at St. Paul's Cathedral in London.

Truro is the most westerly cathedral city in the United Kingdom, standing as the gateway to the ancient county of Cornwall. Cornwall has become well-known in recent years through the PBS television series *Doc Martin* and *Poldark*.

Built between 1880 and 1910, Truro's beautiful Gothic cathedral was the first English cathedral to be built on a new site in England for more than 600 years. It is one of only three U.K. cathedrals with three spires. Another of the three is St. Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh, where St. Paul's Choir sang in 2016.



Truro Cathedral also is famous for having been the location of the first ever Service of Christmas Lessons and Carols, devised in 1880, later made famous at King's College, Cambridge, and used all over the world, including for our own Christmas Eve services at St. Paul's.

While in residence at Truro, St. Paul's Choir will live close to the cathedral and sing for the daily services of Choral Evensong plus a Choral Eucharist service on the Sunday morning.

Each of our Evensong services here, while being a beautiful service in itself, is also preparation for the services at Truro. The Choir of Truro Cathedral will be on vacation at that time, and we are honored that our own choir has been invited to sing in its place for a week.

Following the week in Truro, St. Paul's Choir will travel to London to sing an Evensong service at St. Paul's Cathedral.

One of the most magnificent buildings in the world, St. Paul's Cathedral is built on the site of a previous cathedral destroyed in a devastating fire in 1666. While Westminster Abbey is a royal chapel, St. Paul's has been the cathedral of City of London since 604 AD. It has a world-famous choir of men and boys and is blessed with an echo of approximately ten seconds, making all music sound absolutely beautiful.

Our own St. Paul's Choir has a long tradition of singing at English cathedrals, beginning in 1987 with visits to York Minster, St. Edmundsbury Cathedral, and Westminster Abbey. Since that time, the choir has returned

to Westminster several times, and sung at the cathedrals in Ely, St. Alban's, Southwark, and Exeter. St. Paul's Choir also has sung in LeipzigGermany.

"I am looking forward very much to returning to England with our superb St. Paul's Choir," said St. Paul's Director of Music Christopher Betts. "I spent a week in residence with a choir at Truro Cathedral in the 1990s and enjoyed it very much. I have sung for a service at St. Paul's Cathedral, and it was one of the best experiences of my life; singing there will be a thrill for us all."

Choir residencies such as these strengthen bonds, community, and musicianship, and they equip us even better to lead in worship Sunday-by-Sunday in our own church. The practice of singing together as part of a cathedral community for a week is a spiritual and life-changing experience. St. Paul's Choir has made friends wherever it has gone, and we look forward to making more new friends again as we travel in 2022.

St. Paul's Choir Residency at Truro Cathedral will be from July 25 to 31, 2022, and Evensong at St. Paul's Cathedral in London will be on Monday, August 1, 2022.


